# Kent Test

For children starting secondary school in September 2026

If your child is currently in Year 5, and you intend to apply to a Kent Grammar school, register online at <u>kent.gov.uk/kenttest</u>

Registration opens on 2 June 2025 and closes at midnight on 1 July 2025

#### Who is the Kent Test for?

The Kent Test is for children who wish to apply for a Kent Grammar school place for September 2026 and are either resident in the UK or are the children of UK Service Personnel / other Crown Servants returning to the UK. A list of Kent Grammar schools can be found <u>here</u>. Schools in Medway, Bexley and Bromley are outside the Kent Local Authority area. If you live outside Kent, please consider carefully before registering whether your child can attend the testing session in Kent, and how they would travel to school if they were offered a school place in Kent.

#### How do I register for the Kent Test?

Go to <u>kent.gov.uk/kenttest</u> and create an online account for yourself as parent/guardian. Add your child's details to your account to start the registration process. When you have completed and submitted your registration you should get a confirmation email. If you do not, the registration may not have been completed correctly. (*Tip: Please check your junk/spam folder for the email before contacting us!*)

#### What if my child has access requirements?

If your child has a disability or SEN which will affect their access to testing, you should discuss this with their primary school before registering them, as the school will need to apply for any necessary access arrangements. Requests will not be accepted after 1 July 2025.

#### What happens after I register?

If your child attends a school outside Kent, we will email you details of their test centre by the end of August. Let us know if after registration you move house, change your email address or your child changes primary school. Otherwise, their test papers may go to the wrong place, or you may not get their results.

How do I apply for a Kent Grammar school? You apply by naming the school as a preference on your Local Authority's secondary application form.

#### If my child is assessed suitable for grammar school by the Kent Test, will I automatically be offered a grammar school place?

No, a Kent Grammar school assessment does not guarantee your child a place in a Kent Grammar school.

Grammar schools are often oversubscribed, meaning more children apply than the school has room for. Oversubscribed schools use their admission criteria to rank applicants in priority order, so it's important to check the admission criteria for schools you are interested in. A Kent Grammar school can only consider your child for a place if you have named it on your application and your child has been tested and assessed suitable for admission. If your child is not offered a place at the school, you can appeal to an Independent Appeal Panel and may be able to add them to the school's waiting list.

#### Key dates

Monday 2 June 2025	Registration opens at kent.gov.uk/kenttest. You will receive a confirmation email when registration is complete.
Tuesday 1 July 2025	Registration closes at midnight. If your child attends a school outside Kent, you will receive an email by the end of August with your Allocated Test Centre.
Thursday 11 September 2025	Children who attend a Kent primary school sit the test in their school.
Saturday 13 September 2025 / Sunday 14 September 2025	Children who attend primary schools outside Kent or are Educated at Home sit the test in a Test Centre.
Thursday 16 October 2025	Kent Test Decisions emails are sent after 4pm to the email address used to register the child.

Further information about the test and about transport to grammar school for low-income families can be found on our website at <u>kent\_cov.uk</u>. If your child is outside the age range for the test, or cannot take the test on a Saturday please email <u>kent\_community</u>.

For help registering please email <u>kentonlineadmissions@kent.gov.uk</u>. Only one registration per pupil will be accepted. If you apply online, do not complete any other form of registration. Keep your login details safe and use the email address you registered from for all communication with the team.



# **Outreach at Maidstone Grammar School**

Dear Headteacher, Year 5 teacher, parent and carers,

We are pleased to announce, as part of our outreach programme to primary schools in Term 6, the following opportunities for Year 5 boys at your school wishing to attend a grammar school or Maidstone Grammar School:

#### Football at MGS: Wednesday 11 June – 9am to 12pm

Receive coaching from our football staff and 1st XI, who have won the Kent Cup this season and made it to the quarter finals of the National Cup. The coaching session will be followed by a brief tour of our facilities, including our 3G pitch and fitness suite, and a presentation on our football programme. Following this, a Year 5 tournament will take place on our 3G pitch. There are 100 spaces available.

#### Day at Pompeii: Tuesday 17 June – 8:30am to 2pm

This experience is led by our Latin and Classics department. This will include learning about Pompeii and experiencing it through the lens of art, music, food and nutrition, and Latin. By the end of the day, Year 5 will have learned some Latin, performed music, made art and baked food, each in our dedicated facilities for these subjects. There are 30 spaces available.

#### Rugby at MGS: Wednesday 18 June – 9am to 12pm

We have a local and national reputation for excellence in rugby. Receive coaching from our rugby staff and 1st XV, followed by a brief tour of our facilities, including our 3G pitch and fitness suite, and a presentation on our rugby programme. Following this, a Year 5 tournament will take place on our 3G pitch. There are 100 spaces available.

We appreciate that this takes those Year 5 boys who are interested in attending away from their primary school for a part of the day, but hope that they find the experience enriching and exciting, building on the knowledge and skills they are experiencing with their Year 5 teacher and from their school.
